- Routine information and intelligence sharing mechanisms
- Regional cooperation






Routine information sharing mechanisms

Building permanent and robust mechanisms

- Development of tools for
 - effective information gathering and sharing
 - risk assessment
- Research for increased understanding of the patterns of IUU fishing in the region (identity issues, forgery/fraud, whitewashing of fish, avoidance of enforcement, links to associated crimes, identification of networks/syndicates)
- Strengthening of interagency cooperation
- Ensuring political support for Task Force

High-tech input to provide information
Low-cost model for effective communication and
cooperation









Regional cooperation plays a role

in combatting illegal fishing and associated crimes

- Access to <u>information</u>: timely and relevant
- <u>Cooperation</u> for the effective use of information and to generate enforcement actions
- Reporting on progress within the group (accountability)
